Kitchener Region

- _____ Parish's main altar has a tester hanging over a seven foot high crucifix; carved solid oak paneling; Fresco: the Baptism of the Lord.
- _____ Parish was home of two past Diocesan Presidents; colourful Harambee pole in front; Archangel stained glass feature.
- _____ Parish is built on "Catholic Hill"; "Catherine wheel" window; two towers, one a bell added in 1926.
- _____ Parish sits alongside beautiful walled cemetery; church steeple highest point in region; same priest for 23 years.
- _____ Parish has choir loft with full pipe organ; erected in 1870; ceiling murals of Saints and Lamb of God.
- _____ Parish was established in 1883; home to past Diocesan President; closely affiliated with Catholic school beside church.
- _____ Parish's stain glass window depicts highlights of the Salvation History; changed church & location three times; home to past Diocesan President.
- _____ Parish has six ft. tall statue of the Risen Christ behind the altar; parish life centre with three rooms named after the Archangels; adoration chapel.
- _____ Parish has red light always lite in bell tower; 24 hour adoration chapel; colourful banners hang alongside Jesus on the Cross.
- _____ Parish boasts two Frances Lovering Award winners; a past Diocesan President; prefab church built in 1953.
- _____ Parish has 100 year old trees in front; 70,000 bricks from Twin City buildings were used to build church in 1890; pipe organ installed for Diamond Jubilee.
- _____ Parish held Mass in parishioner's home until the floor collapsed in 1856; parishioners rented their family pew in newly bought Methodist church; had two mission churches.
- _____ Parish is served by Carmelite Priests; lost child garden; home to past Diocesan President.
- _____ Parish had a grotto in 1952; large addition to front of church in 2004; statues of St. Bernadette and Our Lady.
- _____ Parish has been a Jesuit parish since 2001; hand blown glass rosary adorns side of entrance wall; adoration chapel behind the tabernacle.

Parish was first a quarry-stone church, later dismantled and built Cathedral like church in 1922; Fresco painted ceilings.

Parish was a mission church in 1869; new church has adoration chapel with bell tower; altar decorated with motifs: maple leaf, lily, thistle and shamrock.

Parish has carved wooden statue of Saint & wolf at entrance door; atrium in basement; peace garden with bird houses.

Parish founded in Centennial year of Canada; floors slope towards the altar; The Risen Christ in the sanctuary.

Parishes built in 1936; stone quarry church on country hill and in town; gothic windows & quatrefoil shaped vent; new parish planned adjacent to Camp Brebeuf.

Parish has large circular stained glass windows on three side of church; Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration chapel; grotto in honour of Our Lady of Lourdes.

Parish had mass three times a year by missionary Jesuit priests in a log school house; Cathedral style church with 150 ft. steeple; alpha & omega symbols painted on ceiling.

Parish's first church was built in 1856; new church was built on farm land donated by the Wilhelm family; prayer garden with Marian statue.

Parish was built in Gothic style with tin covered steeple and ornate iron cross; Shrine of the Sorrowful Mother; had three different sects of priests

Parish's red brick structure has a cemented tower with cross on top; stained glass window of patron saint; rectangular alcove highlights altar.

Parish was designed in contemporary Canadian style; tent like ceilings highlight wooden beams; huge stained glass windows over entrance of doors.

Parish was built in 1918 for a Polish community; Fresco paintings adorn ceiling; beautiful white tabernacle with stained glass windows of saints surrounding it.

Parish in Gothic style in shape of Latin cross with a large tower on one side and a small tower on the other side; Seven Sorrows paintings dominate ceiling.

Parish was built in 1881 as a mission church; added bells, altar, organ and Stations of the Cross & blue ceilings in 1934; now has a mission church.

Parish had a small wooden church built in 1880; 80 ft. steeple was removed in 1971 renovations; barrel vault ceilings & Gothic stained & frosted glass windows.

Parish held mass in the basement for 20 years; upper church added with stone altar; Ambry restored in sanctuary wall in 1999.

Parish was a log church with Irish & German settlers; forced to worship elsewhere for 30 years; then in a shed, a church was built in 1903; Lourdes Grotto with Stations of the Cross.

Parish is Gothic style redbrick church; Fresco paintings along balcony; Canadian, Italian & Polish community.

Parish was built in 1969 in a unique triangular design; brown brick and wood interior; Italian pipe organ.
