

Empowering Women: A Call to Rekindle the Fire of Faith

In many developing countries, social work units and NGOs often focus on empowering women to bring about community transformation. Women become the catalysts for change, working from within their own cultures and traditions to reshape their societies.

Interestingly, we see a similar trend in the Bible and throughout the history of the Church. In Acts Chapter 16, we read about the Apostle Paul's missionary journey, where his team encounters a group of women gathered by the riverbank in Philippi. Among them is Lydia, a woman of deep faith and leadership. These women had come together for prayer and study, and when they heard Paul's message, Lydia opened her heart to Christ—and her home to His disciples. That very day, the church in Philippi was born.

Though Lydia and her companions are not always mentioned alongside the more prominent figures of the early Church, their contributions were foundational. Quietly, without much publicity, they helped the early Church survive persecution and bear witness to the Gospel. These women of the early Church stand as powerful examples for our Catholic Women's Communities today. They fought the good fight of faith. In simplicity and humility, they fulfilled their mission—and through love, they preserved their faith.

Today, we need many more Lydia's in our communities. Women who will rise with courage, wisdom, and faith to build up the Church from within. Let us encourage and support them, so that together we may rekindle the fire of faith in a world that desperately needs it.



Dear Members of the Catholic Women's League,

The Spiritual Role of the CWL

Throughout the year, I was honoured to be invited by parish councils to **present on various topics and lead retreats** across the diocese. These gatherings allowed us to reflect together on our call to servant leadership, our faith journeys, and our shared responsibility to live as joyful disciples. I also created and continue to offer **key presentations** on *League governance*, *executive responsibilities*, and *faith-rooted leadership*—equipping members to lead with confidence, clarity, and compassion.

With a passion to elevate women in faith-based leadership, I am also privileged to serve on the **Board of Directors for the Catholic Women's Leadership Foundation of Canada**. This national initiative aligns closely with my mission: to champion Catholic women as leaders in

their parishes, communities, and beyond, which led me to inviting my colleague and dear friend Dr. Linda Dudar as our keynote speaker for our 105th AGM/Convention.

Our diocesan work this year has been Spirit-led and action-driven. While we supported two council closures with grace, we celebrated the **reactivation of Incarnation of Our Blessed Lord CWL in Hamilton (after 25 years)** and **St. John the Evangelist in the North Region**—milestones that affirm the power of personal invitation, perseverance, and faith.

Formation was a central pillar of our programming. Our **Leadership Development Days, Mentoring Mondays**, and spiritual retreats provided ongoing, accessible training on League structures, officer roles, faith development, and more. These initiatives, infused with prayer and community, have been embraced across all regions.

Our efforts to deepen spiritual engagement included introducing **rotating monthly Provincial Masses** hosted in different councils—strengthening diocesan unity through shared Eucharist.

We also renewed connections with our clergy. Alongside our Diocesan Spiritual Advisor, Fr. Ranjan D'Sa, we extended personal jointly signed invitations to all parish spiritual advisors, resulting in significantly increased clergy presence at meetings and events.

Innovation and environmental stewardship guided our operational practices. We transitioned to **digital documents and evaluations**, reducing printing costs and our ecological footprint, while enhancing accessibility. We also expanded our fundraising efforts beyond convention, introducing the *Sparkle God's Way* bracelets—symbols of both our mission and our unity.

I was proud to represent our diocese at national and provincial conventions and gatherings where the voice of Hamilton was heard and respected. Today, we are blessed to have a **full diocesan executive**, including all regional chairs and secretaries—positioning us to serve our 86 parish councils with strength, grace, and collaboration.

One of the most powerful outcomes of this year has been the gift of personal invitation. Sixty-five women are attending this convention for the first time, and 60 women from every region volunteered to serve on the convention team—a testament to the strength of our sisterhood and the joy of shared mission.

Dear sisters, Sparkle God's Way is more than a theme—it is a call to live intentionally, lead boldly, and uplift others with joy. Thank you for the ways you shine God's light through every act of faith and service.


Together, we are not only observing the Jubilee Year of Hope—we are living it.

"I Sparkle God's Way by being able to serve you as your treasurer for another two-year term. Thank you for your vote of confidence last May. I will continue to "Sparkle God's Way" for the upcoming year by being available to answer any of your council's financial questions or concerns either by email or phone.

Thank you to the 50 councils that submitted their 2024 Parish Council Annual Report Survey online. This represents 59% of councils reporting, an increase over 2023 of 15%. The summarized report received from National indicated National Voluntary Funds donated to all charities in 2024 totalled \$34,433.00. Breakdown of donations to all charities was National - \$14,801.00 an International - \$19,632.00. Significant and/or unusual donations reported by Parish Councils was \$162,775.00 given locally.

The 2024 financial statements will be presented at the 105th annual convention to be held on May 30, 31 & June 1, 2025 at the Holiday Inn, Burlington, Ontario.

Included with this report is the 2024 Parish Treasurers Annual Summary, which reflects the input from 51 parish councils. Your continued financial support towards Faith, Service and Social Justice to your parish and community and the National Voluntary Fund is indicated in the total donations reported of \$237,191.00.

During my remaining term of 2025 to May, 2026, I plan to compose a guideline of charitable donations under the three standing committees of Faith, Service and Social Justice. Once complete this will then be shared with all parish council treasurers as a guide in completing the annual treasurer report at both National and Diocesan level.

Thanks to your generous donations at the Hamilton Diocesan Convention 2024 Saturday morning Mass during the Eucharistic celebration, we were able to donate \$517.55 to St. Joseph's Villa Foundation.

Thank you to all councils and members who generously donated \$1,295.00 towards Bishop Douglas Crosby's 75th birthday gift. Bishop Crosby in turn donated this to the Diocese of Hamilton Ex Corde Foundation.

I will be presenting a cheque to Father Ranjan D'Sa at the convention's Sunday night banquet in the amount of \$3,249.35 representing Bishop's Charities \$2,953.50 and Our Lady of Good Counsel Seminary Bursary \$295.85.

Dear League sisters,

Mentoring, supporting, offering encouragement and just plain showing up are some of the most important qualities of a Past President Historian. It is the knowledge, experience and giving sage advice that can offer comfort, dispel nerves and build confidence to the Elected Officers and the Council members.

Over the past year, parish council Past Presidents kept members informed of the workings from the national and provincial levels. Another supported the Hamilton Diocese "Resolutions" at the diocesan and provincial conventions. One Past President organized a pilgrimage to the Basilica of Our Lady Immaculate, Guelph. While another reactivated past practices such as civic committee meetings, fellowship events, and Out4Lunch program.

One Past President gifted new members with a prayer intentions book and pen as part of the Welcome Kit. Another Past President organized a YouTube video to showcase member's actions over the years with current and historical photos and used it as a membership recruitment tool. A Council created a display of CWL info, mission and League activities at the entrance of the parish. While others participated in recruiting new members and outreach to senior members in their parish.

A responsibility of the Past President Historian is to be the keeper of the history and archives for the Council. Many Councils culled, scanned, completed history and shared archives with the membership. One Council introduced League activities & articles on a local newspaper blog. Many Councils took photos of special events, general meetings, workshops, food and clothing drives, milestone birthdays, installation ceremonies, membership pin presentations, fundraisers, community projects, and student awards to name a few.

Four Councils celebrated their 100th Anniversary of the League and two Councils celebrated 70 years in the League. Historical displays, memorabilia of photos/newspaper articles, special Masses, luncheon/banquet, Family Tea, honouring past presidents, presentation of plaque, video presentation highlighting history of council, group photo of members on church steps,

memories from past presidents were organized for the celebrations. Councils invited the Bishop of Hamilton, National, Provincial and Diocesan Presidents, Diocesan Executive members and Life Members to attend the special celebrations. One Council presented Bishop Douglas Crosby OMI with a letter written by Saint Teresa of Calcutta for the Diocese of Hamilton, Bishop Farrell Library and Archives.

Councils involved the youth in the "Go Make a Difference" Community Project by welcoming students to serve and volunteer at their Anniversary celebrations as well as preparing a luncheon for parishioners. One Council involved a high school class to make and engrave a plaque honouring the 100th Anniversary of the League. Another council gave a presentation to grade 6 class about the history, purpose and activities of CWL and their importance to the parish and community; letters and an invitation to join were sent home to the Moms to encourage further conversation with their child; posters were made by the students to celebrate the council's 100th Anniversary of the League.

Councils recognized the importance of their Spiritual Advisors with a special luncheon, a photo memory book, and spiritual bouquets. A special spiritual bouquet for Bishop Douglas Crosby, OMI 75th birthday was planned and members were able to sign a birthday card at the 104th Annual Diocesan Convention.

Some future goals for the next year are: labeling/organizing archival material for the Hamilton CWL archives, updating photo albums, creating a checklist for Parish Councils. Encouraging Councils to display their archives yearly to allow non-members to witness the accomplishments of the League.

Another goal is to organize the 2026 Diocesan Elections by preparing nominations and elections packages. Hamilton Diocesan Council has many talented and gifted members who are called to serve the members of our League and in so doing, reaching out to our sisters beyond our own borders. I hope to encourage Councils/members to be visible as leaders in the parish community and in their ministry for God and Canada.

As Sisters of the League, we foster a sense of belonging to a community of women, who inspire each other to lead spirit-filled lives as we joyfully affirm that God's presence blesses every aspect of our ordinary life. The incredible work, and dedication of the members from the Hamilton Diocesan Council shows their commitment to this promise. May Our Lady of Good Counsel guide us to her Son and may we discover everlasting joy in finding Him.

This past year has been a meaningful and active one for the Catholic Women's League at St. Basil Parish in Brantford. I am pleased to present this annual report, highlighting the dedication, compassion, and faith-filled service of our members.

In May 2024, our council was represented at the Hamilton Diocesan Convention by Vice President Leeanne Vreugdenhil and Secretary Lorraine Good, who attended on my behalf. Their comprehensive report was shared with our membership during the July 2, 2024, general meeting.

Over the summer, we welcomed Sheila Robertson into the role of Treasurer, following the passing of our dear sister in the League, Christine Telfer. Sheila has embraced this important role with care and commitment.

Through our ongoing support of Catholic education, we were pleased to provide bursaries to Assumption College School and each of our three parish elementary schools. We also donated funds to Camp Brébeuf and Camp Marydale, enabling one child at each camp to enjoy a week of day camp—a gift of summer joy and faith formation.

I had the privilege of attending the Ontario Provincial Convention in July, held in Sudbury. It was an inspiring and enriching experience, filled with presentations, voting sessions, and powerful witness. Bishop Thomas Dowd's presence and words were especially moving and affirming of the League's mission.

In September, I participated in the Hamilton/Brantford Regional meeting, which fostered connection and shared direction for our regional councils. Diocesan President Teresa DiFalco provided servant Leadership training and development, which was most insightful and inspiring. I have learned so much under her kind and professional leadership.

On October 20, 2023, our members joyfully packed and shipped over 100 shoeboxes to *Food for Children*, destined for children in Peru. We also sent 17 handmade sleeping mats—acts of charity that reflect our mission to serve with love.

In January 2025, I attended a general meeting hosted by the CWL at St. Pius X. Among our discussions were the upcoming joint Masses planned for April 5 and May 3, as well as a shared vision for a CWL pilgrimage to various parishes within our Diocese that have been designated Holy

Door sites during the Jubilee Year of Hope. This pilgrimage has now been confirmed for June 7, 2025.

Here at St. Basil's, our January "Coffee and Chatter" gathering after the 9:30 AM Mass featured a silent auction. The event was a great success, raising funds to help offset convention costs, support school bursaries, and contribute to camp sponsorships.

Later in the year, I was delighted to start a Craft Club, which has grown to include six dedicated members. Together, we knit and crochet hats, scarves, and mittens. Some items were sold to raise funds for the CWL, while others were donated—two large bags to local individuals experiencing homelessness and two totes to the St. Vincent de Paul Society.

Looking ahead, our council is preparing to host a First Communion Luncheon on May 25, 2025. We are honoured that our Hamilton Diocesan President, Teresa DiFalco, will be our special guest speaker, presenting on the CWL's Three Pillars: Faith, Service, and Social Justice.

We are proud to share that three members of our council will be attending the 105th Hamilton Diocesan CWL Convention later this month. Their participation ensures our continued engagement and presence in the wider CWL sisterhood.

I offer heartfelt thanks to every member of our St. Basil CWL council. Their dedication, prayers, and service are the light of Christ in action and the hope to continue to grow and strengthen our CWL Council. May we continue to "Sparkle God's Way" and be beacons of hope and light to all those we encounter. I love this theme, and find it so uplifting and inspiring.





The new Leadership Team model, introduced in 2023, which replaced the Executive model of governance in our parish League has been received with support and favour by members and by our Spiritual Director, Father Hayden, Starczala.

Under the direction of the Leadership Team, we have conducted general membership gatherings in September, November, January and April. These meetings have been fruitful in conducting business, generating ideas, making decisions and providing learning opportunities. Outcomes of these meetings include;

- a decision to allocate at least 25% of fundraising moneys to parish needs,
- a presentation from Guelph-Wellington Women in Crisis outlining the services they provide in our community,
- introduction of a recruitment/volunteer focused campaign to fill leadership roles which replaced the previous nomination model,
- -viewing a film 'Introduction to the Jubilee Year 2025 Pilgrims of Hope', followed by an exercise exploring the concept/meaning of Hope as experienced through our Catholic faith, church tradition, the word, sacred liturgy and music,
- -agreement to launch a member volunteer giving campaign for the fall of 2025,
- and the announcement of our 2026 Incoming Leadership Team.

In addition to these gatherings we held Leadership Team meetings in June and February. These meetings provided the small group of six an opportunity to review our organization structure, leadership roles, goals and objectives. We discussed a Member Planned giving program, developed a Leadership Succession plan. We reviewed leadership roles and developed Role Descriptions. We established and launched a new recruitment structure to fill leadership roles.

In June and December, 2024 and February, 2025 we published 'Go Forth Together', St. Mary's CWL Newsletter. This publication provides an avenue to communicate to all members on a regular and ongoing basis.

We conducted a successful membership drive that saw 79 member renewals and 4 new memberships for a total of 83 members. On January 1, the Solemnity of Mary, we conducted the presentation of services pins (for the years 2019 – 2024) following the 11:00 am mass. Five members received 15-year pin, four members 25-year pin, seven 40-year pin, two 50 -year pin, four 55 - year pin, five 60 -year pin, and three 65 -year pin. On March 8 we formed an honour guard at the funeral of Mary Klein, a 65- year CWL member and parishioner of St. Mary's.

Our fundraising efforts consisted of our annual Bake Sale in May, proceeds from the Good Will collection from the Advent Reflection afternoon and assisting as servers for the Knights of Columbus charity breakfast in March.

The Spiritual activities included the distribution of thirty-five prayer cards to the First Communicants in June, co-hosting an Advent Reflection afternoon with the Knights of Columbus on December 1, and fulfilling 641 prayer intentions through our weekly Prayer Intention program.

Recipients of our Giving and Financial support included; the Christmas Charity drive held December 7 for Guelph-Wellington Women In Crisis, a annual scholarship to a deserving graduate(s) of Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic High School in Guelph, a graduation award to a student(s) of St. Mary Catholic Elementary school in Elora as well as financial support to Michael House in Guelph, Guelph-Wellington Right to life, Catholic Missions of Canada and for parish needs at St. Mary's.

To celebrate our members, the League and our neighbouring sisters in the CWL we hosted a joint year end mass and potluck dinner with St. Joseph's, Fergus in June and once again with St. Joseph's CWL for a pre-Christmas mass and Turkey dinner in December.

As we close this Annual Report and reflect on the many blessings of the past year, we thank You for Your constant presence in our lives and in the work of the League.


