### **Pilgrims of Hope – Jubilee Year 2025**

Pope Francis has declared this year as the Jubilee Year of Hope.

Celebrating Jubilee Year is an ancient tradition very well documented in the Old Testament. Judaism celebrated every 50th year as the year of the Lord. It is written in Leviticus chapter 25: "...on the Day of Atonement sound the trumpet throughout your land. Consecrate the 50th year and proclaim liberty throughout the land to all its inhabitants. It shall be a jubilee for you; each of you is to return to your family property and to your own clan" (9 – 11). Since God is the creator and the owner of all that is existing, freeing the land, slaves and debtors was a mere gesture of acknowledging and accepting God's authority over everything.

The Catholic church revived the ancient biblical tradition of celebrating the Year of Jubilee in 1300 AD with the Papal Bull "Antiquorum fida relation" by Pope Boniface VIII. An unusually large number of pilgrims gathered at Saint Peters to celebrate Christmas with the hope of getting an indulgence of remission of sins. Though Pope Boniface VIII had not planned to grant anything, looking at the vast number of crowds, he granted them an indulgence and established the Year of Jubilee. From then every 100 years was designated as a year of jubilee.

Many thought that 100 years is a big gap between the jubilees, so in 1342, Pope Clement VI, reduced it to 50 years and celebrated it in 1350 AD. For the next hundred years there were many variations of jubilee time regarding its years between jubilees. Finally, Pope Paul II extended the inter-jubilee period to 25 years, and in 1475 a Holy Year was celebrated by Sixtus IV.

"Pilgrims of Hope" is the theme for our Jubilee year 2025. Pope Francis invites all to participate in the Year of Hope inviting them to be drawn to this hope. He then expresses his vision for the Year of Hope: "We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision."

Let this Jubilee Year rekindle hope in us.

Dearest League Sisters, and Spiritual Advisors,

As we journey together in faith, the fall season is a beautiful witness to how our League continues to Sparkle God's Way — shining as beacons of hope, light, and love in our parishes, families, and communities. I am deeply grateful for the spirit, openness, and generosity of our members, whose feedback, prayers, and participation shape our Hamilton Diocesan Council and initiatives.

Listening carefully to our members, I intentionally designed the fall presentations and workshops to respond to what you shared with me — the desire for encouragement, practical leadership support, deeper faith formation, and renewed hope during times of change. Together, we reflect on how God calls each of us to let our light shine brightly, especially when others may feel uncertain, weary, or lost.

This year, we are blessed with many diocesan highlights. Our 105th Diocesan Convention and Annual Meeting of Members was a tremendous success, reflected in the warm and affirming feedback received from members. Convention costs were significantly reduced through careful stewardship and the outstanding success of our Sparkle God's Way fundraising initiatives, which will continue to support our diocesan work. I was grateful for the opportunity to visit parish councils across the diocese, offering support, encouragement, and practical assistance. One especially meaningful experience was meeting with a group of young mothers who shared concerns about the League. Through open dialogue and a League presentation, their questions were addressed, relationships were built, and these women chose to join the CWL — a powerful reminder that invitation, listening, and love truly matter.

We also celebrated the reactivation of two councils this year, a council in the North serving Dundalk, Proton, and Shelbourne, and another council in Hamilton, a joyful sign of renewal and perseverance. I was honoured to attend both Provincial and National Conventions, where four resolutions were presented at Provincial, three of which passed, and four resolutions were

presented and adopted at National. These resolutions reflect the League's strong voice and commitment to faith, service, and social justice.

At National Convention, we welcomed a new National President, Betty Colaneri, as Past President Shari Guinta concluded her term. We were also introduced to the new National theme, Ignite Your Passion, Empower His Mission — a timely and inspiring call for each of us to live our faith boldly. At the Provincial Convention, we were enriched by keynote speaker Dr. Josephine Lombardi, who spoke on the Marian Approach to Synodality — walking together in Christ and loving one another with humility, trust, and grace. Full reports on these activities are published in The Sparkle Spectrum, and I encourage all members to take time to read and reflect on them.

Looking ahead, I remind members that diocesan elections will take place next year and I encourage eligible members to prayerfully discern how you might share your gifts and talents in leadership and service. Letters will be sent to eligible members early in the new year to support this discernment process.

Our diocesan faith and service initiatives continue to be a source of great pride and purpose. These include a diocesan Advent Retreat open to all members, ongoing support for Indigenous communities through Sacred Sparks 72-hour emergency kits, and the creation of hand-made Dolls and toys (Sparkle Dolls & Toys) in support of a Catholic Medical Missions to Ghana through Our Lady of the Assumption Parish in Hamilton. These initiatives beautifully reflect our call to serve with compassion, generosity, and faith in action.

Members are encouraged to share their stories of their love for the League and what inspired you to join and what inspires you to stay. This sharing are powerful testament to the quiet yet profound witness we offer simply by being present, faithful, and united as sisters in Christ.

Leadership and spiritual enrichment will be at the heart of our fall gatherings. Under the theme "Sparkle in the Season of Change as the Harvest of Hope and Light," we will reflect on sisterhood, servant leadership, gratitude, and our call as Catholic women to be beacons of faith and social justice. Formation sessions will focus on "Sparkle God's Way – You Are a Star," using the imagery of stars and constellations to explore a sisterhood belonging, shared charisms, collective gifts, and the importance of self-care for sustainable service.

Through the Servant Sparkle Leadership Development Workshop, we will explore a S.P.A.R.K.L.E. framework — Serving with joy, Promoting with purpose, Activating the gifts of others, Reaching out with grace, Keeping the flame of faith alive, Leading with love, and Embracing everyone. Leadership is relational, invitational, and deeply rooted in Christ.

We will explore how we are all stars in a beautiful constellation called sisterhood. Allowing our inner Sparkle to shine, is representative of the Light of Christ within us as daughters of God. We are called to Sparkle, live joyfully, and to experience being cherished and loved — while forever reminding us of the enduring nature of love and community.

Always remember to leave a little Sparkle wherever you go and remain centered on sisterhood, trust, Christ-centred servant leadership, inclusivity, healing, and ongoing renewal. Stay in the light and welcome others to bask in love of God.

As your Diocesan President, it is truly an honour and a blessing to serve you. I am continually inspired by your faith, generosity, and commitment to living the Gospel. Thank you for allowing me to walk alongside you, to listen, to serve, and to Sparkle God's Way together — letting our light shine brightly so that others may see hope, love, and Christ reflected through us.

As we enter the season of Fall we give thanks to The Lord for providing farmers and gardeners with a bountiful harvest.


With the coming of Fall we turn our minds to the activities we have planned for the upcoming fall and winter months.

Fall is the most beautiful time of year in my mind. The cool crispness to the air, the time for harvesting all the bounties from the garden and the vibrant colours as the leaves change from green to red, orange and yellow. It reminds me of all the wonders that Christ has instore for us as we move from one season to the next.

It is also a time for cleanup, getting things organized and updating files or reviewing policies. The Policies and Procedures Manual contains detailed information and helpful examples/standard rules to follow when performing the work of the League.

The National P&P Manual was last updated in 2024 and can be found on the website (cwl.ca) as well as the Hamilton CWL website (cwlhamilton.ca). A member can put forward a proposed revision to the National P&P manual by December 1, 2025. Form 201 can be found under Resources on the national website.

Each Council Parish should have their own set of Policies and Procedures. Policies are established by motions or long-standing customs. Some examples are:

- Meetings – Executive, General
- Monthly Mass & Special Masses
- Annual Budget Preparation
- Annual Meeting of Members (convention) policy – paid expenses for voting/accredited delegates (travel, hotel, meals
- Member Recognition – membership pins, special awards,
- Book of Life Protocol
- Get Well wishes/Expressions of Sympathy
- School bursaries

**2025.02** Amend the Canadian Criminal Code Section 223(1) defining when a child becomes a human being

**2025.03** Strengthen Support for Chaplains to Provide Faith-Based Care to Members and Families of the Canadian Armed Forces

**2025.04** Federal Government to Complete the Development of the Office of Palliative Care

Social justice issues are problems that arise when there is inequality, discrimination, or unfair treatment within a society, hindering some groups from accessing their rights, opportunities, and resources. For example, some key social justice issues could include: racial and gender inequality, economic disparity, lack of healthcare and food access, environmental concerns, and discrimination based on factors like disability, age, or sexual orientation.

One particular area of social justice is the problem of homelessness. The Canadian Alliance to End Homelessness (CAEH) encourages you to send letters to the Prime Minister, the Housing Minister, the Finance Minister and the Finance Committee to demand leadership on homelessness and to fix the housing crisis. There should be affordable and supportive housing, and support for communities to resolve unsheltered homelessness faster.

The goal of social justice is to create a fair, equitable, and inclusive society where everyone has the opportunity to reach their full potential. Addressing social justice issues can lead to a more stable society, greater empathy, and shared prosperity for all.

When your council works on resolutions, you bring Hope and Light to situations that you may have encountered, undertaken or witnessed. Look around your community, province or country. What could you, would you, work to change?



### **Debrief Report on Ontario Provincial Convention 2025**

#### **A Sparkling Experience of Faith, Leadership, and Sisterhood**

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

I had the privilege of representing our Hamilton Diocesan Council as a member of the Provincial Council as our Council's Voting Delegate at the 78<sup>th</sup> Annual Ontario Provincial Convention and Annual Meeting of Members, held in London Ontario from July 5 – 9, 2025. Attending with me were, Vice-President Laura Grint, and Secretary Joanne Palmer who both attended as Accredited Voting Delegates for the Hamilton Diocesan Council. We were joined by Treasurer Mary Clark, Past-President Joyce Cotter, Social Justice Chair Julia Calverley, Hamilton Regional Chair Colleen Ionson, Kitchener Regional Chair Bernadette Best from the Hamilton Diocesan Council Team. Four Parish Presidents attended from the Hamilton Region, one Parish President from the Kitchener Region, one member from the Hamilton Region, and six Life Members.

### **Provincial Pre-convention Meeting and the London Experience**

I attended the Provincial pre-convention meeting from 8:30am – 1:30pm on the Sunday, along with the Provincial Officers and other Diocesan Presidents, while the other members embarked on London Tours. Our Diocesan group enjoyed a guided tour of St. Peter's Seminary.

### **Liturgies**

The liturgies throughout the convention were truly beautiful, with Bishop Campeau and several clergy celebrating the Masses with reverence and joy.

The Opening Ceremony and Mass took place at St. Justine's, with the opening ceremonies first followed by the Opening Mass. There was no procession except for the three flags – The Canada Flag carried by National President Shari Guinta, the Provincial Flag carried by London Diocesan President Denise Morris, and the CWL flag carried by Provincial President Colleen Martin. The church was very warm as there was no air conditioning. A brief reception followed in the parish hall, again warm with no air-conditioning. I look at it this way, the majority of us grew up without the luxury of air-conditioning and to be thankful for the opportunity and not having to wear a Chasuble on top of our clothing like our dear clergy. The closing Mass was just as lovely and meaningful.

### **Leading the Diocesan Reports**

I was humbled to lead the collaboration and presentation of the 12 Diocesan Reports. To celebrate our shared spirit, I composed a song that embraced the beauty and gifts of each diocese and diocesan council across Ontario. I have been asked to record and share it, which I will. All in attendance participated in singing it and the reception of the lyrics were very moving. We carried the sunflower theme into our diocesan presidents presentation, symbolizing how diocesan presidents – like sunflowers – spread seeds across their regions as leader, mentors and builders of membership and sisterhood.

To bring this vision to life, I ordered sunflower costumes for our group. What began as a joyful prop soon became a delight across the convention floor. Provincial President Colleen Martin, Bishop Campeau, and even other clergy joined in the fun, wearing our sunflower costumes with smiles that lit up the room.

I was moved to tears when my sister diocesan presidents surprised me with a Spiritual Bouquet and a beautiful card, a gesture of gratitude that I will forever cherish.

### **Keynote Inspiration**

The keynote address was offered by Dr. Josephine Lombardi, presenting from her book *Marian Approaches to Synodality*. She reminded us that synodality is about *walking together in Christ*, rooted in three forms:

- **Christology:** *Jesus is the Way*
- **Ecclesiology:** *The Church is the Way to the Way*
- **Mariology:** *Mary show us the Way to Jesus*

Her words deeply resonated: “The worst kind of envy is the envy of one person’s personal gifts.” This truth reminded me of our diocesan Sparkle theme. God gave each of us unique gifts meant to shine – our personal “sparkle.” As Matthew 5:15-16 reminds us, “let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.”

### **Sparkle Throughout the Convention**

Ironically, our diocesan theme, Sparkle God’s Way, twinkled throughout the convention. The Provincial Executive presentations were both creative and entertaining, radiating joy, and delivering informative messages. Presentations/Reports were also given by our new Ontario Spiritual Advisor, Most Reverend Bishop Alan Campeau, Ontario Provincial President Colleen Martin, National President Shari Guinta, and National Vice-President, Betty Colaneri; while workshop presentations such as *Ignite the League – One Spark at a Time* inspired us to bring new light and energy into our parish councils. I particularly respected the credit that the Provincial President gave to another executive member for helping write her report, recognizing and utilizing the gifts of others. It reminded me of one of Mother Teresa’s famous quotes - “*I have gifts that you don’t have and you have gifts that I don’t have but together we can do great things.*” How very true. I encourage all members to recognize, share and embrace each other’s gifts for the betterment of the work we do for God and Canada.

### **Recognizing the Good Works of others through Social Justice/Advocacy**

The Social Justice Award was presented to Syl Roach, a member from St. Catharines Diocese, accepted with gratitude by their diocesan president.

### **Highlights of Faith and Fellowship**

Among the spiritual highlights was the Evening Prayer and Healing/Reconciliation Service facilitated by our new Ontario Provincial Spiritual Advisor, Most Reverend Bishop Alan Campeau. His presence, warmth, and joy touched everyone.

And there was Fun Night! The London Diocese hosted a spirited game night where dioceses competed against each other. Our team was named Sparkle God’s Way. We wore black and our Sparkle God’s Way Pins. Each team ran a circuit of games and the team with the most points won a prize. Hamilton Diocesan Council did well, with Ashley Palmer (Joanne’s daughter) putting the only hole in one! We were gifted with Canada Day gear. Despite the summer heat wave and no air conditioning, the laughter, prizes, and camaraderie created lasting memories.

Of course, no convention would be complete without a few surprises! A little after midnight one evening, a false fire alarm had us all evacuating the hotel in our pajamas, standing in the parking lot as fire trucks arrived to check things out. Needless to say, I was in the middle of my bedtime bath. All I can say is – it’s no easy task rushing out of a tub and trying to dress a wet body in a hurry! *LOL*. It was one of those moments that reminded us that sisterhood includes not only prayer and business, but also laughter and shared adventures.

### **Resolutions and Business Sessions**

Diocesan Social Justice Chair Julia Calverley and I were asked to be table facilitators for the Resolutions Dialogue session, taking members through three Resolutions, which were then presented during the business meeting, debated and voted on. The resolutions and their outcome are:

- 1) ON.25.01 Expand the Criminal Code to protect Politicians Against Acts of Violence and Incivility – Gifted by Sault Ste. Marie Diocesan Council **DEFEATED**
- 2) ON.25.02 Federal Government to Create a Unified and Centralized Cybercrime Reporting System for All Canadians – Gifted by Toronto Diocesan Council **ADOPTED**
- 3) ON.25.03 Federal Government to Develop the Health Canada Office of Palliative Care – Gifted by the Toronto Diocesan Council **ADOPTED**

These important steps reflect our League's commitment to faith and social justice.

### **Convention Credentials**

Final credentials confirmed the vibrant presence of the League across Ontario:

- Diocesan Voting Delegates: **12**
- Executive Voting Delegates: **9**
- Diocesan Accredited Delegates: **16**
- Parish Accredited Delegates: **45**

Looking ahead, we are eager to join our sisters at the Fall Regional Meeting and the upcoming Diocesan Advent Retreat, where we know we will be spiritually enriched and strengthened in our collective mission.

We continue to place our trust in the intercession of Our Lady of Good Counsel, praying for wisdom, grace, and unity. With hearts lifted in prayer, we ask our Lord, the Prince of Peace, to open the way toward healing, understanding, and renewed acceptance of our League within our parish. It is deeply disheartening that the current disconnect arises from financial expectations placed upon us, including the sanctioning of a \$2,500 hall rental fee for CWL activities. We are encouraged, however, that this matter is under review.

Through it all, we remain most grateful for the many parishioners who support us, walk beside us in faith, and continue to pray with us.



In June, awards were presented to 2 Grade 8 grads and 2 Grade 12 grads from our Walkerton Catholic schools.

Several members worked with SHHS students to prepare and serve a luncheon to paying patrons with proceeds going back to the high school.
